Orchid Cultivation under Residential Indoor Environments

#### **Biography**

Carlos was born and raised in Caracas, Venezuela. He received his doctoral degree in Agricultural Chemistry from UC Davis, California, and worked for the food industry for 35 years. He lives in Basking Ridge, New Jersey, and has been cultivating orchid plants in his home for the last 25 years. He records his horticultural experiences and has been publishing them in magazines such as Orchids and Orchid Digest.

Orchid plants evolved since the mid-Cretaceous period and naturally migrated to all continents. However, since the dawn of the neolithic era, humans have conceived new kinds of growing environments, each with distinctive horticultural characteristics. Residential indoor environments are particularly widespread but also the most challenging for orchid cultivators. Factors such as pot type, potting media, and other growing conditions will be discussed to foster horticultural success under the harsh household conditions.




